Independent Cambridge Consultant

Many of you will remember me from years ago riding my various ponies and then horses around the village, as life goes on so did I. When I grew up I moved to the Cotswolds, met and married Leigh, then we had Grainne!

I came across the Cambridge Weight Plan when Grainne was 7 months old and had decided it was time to get on and lose the baby weight.... in 1 week I'd lost 7lbs and in 2 months an incredible 2 stone! I'm so passionate about my business - it's so fulfilling and I feel so lucky to be able to make a massive difference to people's lives as well as building a future for my children - feel free to stop me and ask about it all when you see me out walking in the village with Grainne and Rosie... obviously I offer a villagers discount!

Catherine Glazebrook (nee Mayer)

I restore old photos as a part-time hobby/income and I've been doing this since 1995.

The one thing I do have over the mobile phone and places like 'Snappy Shots' on the high street is I offer a more personalised service so people bring the photos along to me or they can scan them if they have the facility and upload the images to my website.

From there I keep in constant communication with the customer sending them images to review by email so that they get exactly what they want as a final image.

I can provide printed images up to A3 on glossy, satin or matt paper and canvas if required. I am also able to provide even bigger pictures by using outsourced suppliers but the one thing I can guarantee is that the original photo/image people give me never leaves my possession so you won't find it ending up on some obscure website.

My specialism is restoring really old (1900) photos and I pride myself on what I have been able to achieve with time and patience. This typically involves removing scratches and creases, replacing body parts (without the aid of a scalpel or anaesthetic) and improving the tone of a photo reproducing it in either black and white or sepia depending on the period the photo was taken. I can even colourise a black and white photo!
