TEWKESBURY BOROUGH COUNCIL – EXTRACT FROM "BONFIRES" LEAFLET (AUG 2012)

Introduction

Whilst bonfires can be a convenient way of getting rid of garden waste they can become a nuisance when the smoke and smells they emit spreads to another person's property. Emissions may have an adverse effect on a person's health if that person is asthmatic, has bronchitis, or has a heart condition. Bonfires can be dangerous if not properly maintained or if dangerous substances are burnt.

When Can I Have A Bonfire?

There are no regulations or byelaws dictating the time when a bonfire may or may not be lit. In general you shouldn't light a bonfire if it is likely to cause a nuisance to anyone else. On occasions such a Guy Fawkes Night try to avoid small individual bonfires by joining in with a group or go to an official event.

What Can't I Burn On A Bonfire?

- treated wood including sheds and fence panels
- green garden material (garden waste that hasn't been dried)
- household rubbish
- rubber tyres
- old engine oil
- methylated spirits
- petrol
- Anything containing plastic, foam or paint

What Precautions Should I Take To Ensure My Bonfire Does Not Disturb Others?

- warn neighbours, especially if there is washing hanging out to dry
- avoid lighting fires in unsuitable weather conditions smoke hangs in the air on damp, still days and in the evening. If it is windy, smoke may be blown into neighbours' gardens and across roads. Remember it is an offence to allow smoke to obstruct a public highway
- avoid burning at weekends and on public holidays when people want to enjoy the use of their gardens
- avoid burning when air pollution in your area is high or very high. This information is included in weather forecasts.
- never leave a fire unattended or leave it to smoulder especially at night – douse it with water if necessary.
