

Leigh Neighbourhood Development Plan Nears Adoption

Our NDP has now been approved by the Independent Examiner, a barrister, with only a few minor amendments.

The Examiner commented "I commend the Draft NDP for being clear, intelligible and well written, and for the considerable effort that has gone into its creation." Personally I would like to thank all those who have contributed to this very long project.

TBC expect, at a meeting early June, to approve the NDP being taken to a referendum at the end of July when all registered residents of The Leigh Parish will be able to vote. If more than 50% of the vote are in favour of the NDP it should be formally adopted in September.

Completion of the NDP will allow the Parish to receive much higher contributions from developments in the Parish as well as having an influence on future planning applications. In its already advanced state it is hoped that the NDP can influence house designs at the large development at Coombe Hill to be more sympathetic to its rural surroundings.

The Leigh website has the latest version of our NDP and will be updated in these final stages. Colin W

The Bells of St Catherine, The Légh – A Sensitive Subject

The Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, in conjunction with The Archbishops Council, have issued a recommended protocol to be followed in the event of the passing of our Monarch.

The protocol is suggesting /recommending church bells be rung at nominated times during the official mourning period, it also recommends bells be (at least) half muffled during this period

Unfortunately St Catherine's, The Leigh do not have bell muffles, apart from "homemade" carpet wraps which have a very short wear life.



A set of dedicated muffles will cost from £225.50 for half muffles to £471.50 for full muffles. St Catherine's finances are not in a good state and current expenditure is limited to essentials only, therefore we have a bit of a problem.

We have received offers of donations to help cover the cost of the muffles. Is there anyone else in the community who would also wish to donate especially as we approach the Jubilee celebrations?
