Most readers know of the cyber attack on the Borough Council's website that caused planning applications to be delayed and disrupted. Hopefully, everything is now back to normal, but it's a good idea to check if you have submitted any documents that they are where they should be.

# Handmade Christmas cards for Sale

Lynne and I have been working hard to make up an exciting selection of Christmas and greetings cards that will be for sale on 17th October. The money raised will go towards funding Cobalt's specialist Breast Cancer Research Nurses.

In recent years the charity has been able to fund a team of specialist nurses, a senior research screening radiographer and a research support officer at the Thirlestaine Breast Centre, Cheltenham. This makes it a significant research centre, attracting high calibre staff and enabling some patients to take part in one of the clinical trials, which allows the clinicians to offer the most up-to-date treatments.

In the last year, 1,300 patients have taken part in the BRAID (Breast Screening; Risk Adaptive Imaging for Density) Trial. This a national trial taking place across 9 centres, including Colbalt, Cheltenham Imaging for this trial includes Contrast-Enhanced Mammography (the CEM equipment has been purchased by Cobalt) and Abbreviated Breast MRI scans (AB-MRI). The use of these combined scans is crucial in revealing cancer present which does not show up on more conventional scans.





Once again, Cobalt will be taking part in The Big Give Christmas Challenge, which means that all the money raised by card sales made by our little Sandhurst group will be matched by a benefactor and, therefore, doubled!

The Deerhurst Dragon.

The following report is out of Rudder's Printed in 1779:

Common occurrences are improper for history, because uninteresting; and the marvellous and wonderful are to be admitted with caution. Finding the following story in Sir Robert Atkyns, is my only reason for giving it a place in this account.

The story is, that a serpent of a prodigious bigness was a great grievance to all the country about Deerhurst, by poisoning the inhabitants and killing their cattle. The inhabitants petitioned the king, and a proclamation was issued out, that whosoever should kill the serpent t should enjoy an estate on Walton-hill in this parish, which then belonged to the crown. One John Smith, a labourer, engaged in the enterprise, and succeeded. For having put a quantity of milk in a place to which the serpent resorted, he gorged the whole, agreeable to expectation, and lay down to sleep in the sun, with his scales ruffled up. Seeing him in that situation, Smith advanced and striking between the scales with his axe, took off his head. The family of the Smiths enjoyed the estate, when Sir Robert compiled this account t, and Mr Lane, who married a widow of that family, had then the axe in his possession.

There is a field on the north side of the canal with a hump in it called the Dragons Tump.
