'There were news boys on street corners shouting out that the 'War is Over'. I followed the crowds to Trafalgar Square and down the Mall. There were masses of people dancing, laughing and generally very happy. There was no room for cars as the roads were full of people... It took some time to get used to going to bed and not worrying about any bombs.'

Dorothy, born in London and stayed until she was 32. During wartime she remembers walking over bombed buildings and rubble to get to St Paul's Cathedral to be confirmed by the Bishop of London.

🔨 16 Week Road Closure, Coombe Hill 🎊

The road closure will be part of a bigger scheme to widen the A38 and A4019, install new traffic signals, renew existing drainage, enhance pedestrian and cycle facilities and landscaping. Initial preparation includes site clearance ahead of the main construction phase, which will start in June 2025, for approximately 12 months.

Closure of the A4019 (estimated for sixteen weeks, June - Oct) from Coombe Hill junction to Knightsbridge Business Park will be fully closed. The A38 will remain open. Access will be available for affected

homeowners during this period.

The upgrade to the A38/A4019 junction at Coombe Hill was part of the the M5 Junction 10 Improvements Scheme, which gained £249M of funding in 2020 from UK Government's Housing Infrastructure Fund (HIF), administered by Homes England.

Easter Simnel Cake

This Gary Rhodes recipe is guaranteed delicious! Jo R

225 g (8 oz) plain flour
1 teaspoon ground mixed spice
½ teaspoon ground cinnamon
175 g (6 oz) butter
175 g (6 oz) light brown soft sugar
A pinch of salt. 3 eggs, beaten
1 tablespoon golden syrup, warmed
175 g (6 oz) sultanas and 175 g (6 oz) currants
100 g (4 oz) glacé cherries and mixed peel, chopped
2-3 tablespoons brandy
600 g (1 lb 5 oz) marzipan
1 tablespoon warmed apricot jam, strained. 1 egg, for glazing
20 cm (8 in) deep, round tin, greased and lined with greaseproof paper. Heat oven to 170°C/325°F/Gas Mark 3.



Cream together the butter and soft brown sugar until light and fluffy. Slowly add eggs and beat into the butter mix. Add the golden syrup, with sifted flour, dried spices and salt. Add all fruits and brandy. If the mixture is very thick, soften with milk. Spoon half the mix into tin. Smooth flat, making sure there are no air bubbles. Roll 200 g (7 oz) of the marzipan into a 20 cm (8 in) disc and place on top. Pour on and smooth the remaining cake mix.

For best results, wrap and tie brown paper around tin. Bake in the pre-heated oven for 1½-2 hours. After 1½ hours, check every 10 minutes by pressing in the centre; the cake will feel firm when it's ready. When the cake is done, remove from the oven and rest for 30 minutes. Turn out onto a wire rack.

Once absolutely cold, roll another 200 g (7 oz) of marzipan into a 20 cm (8 in) disc. Brush the cake with apricot jam. Place the marzipan disc on top. Brush with some beaten egg and colour under a pre-heated grill to a light golden brown.

The remaining 200 g (7 oz) of marzipan can now be shaped into eleven small balls (represents the 11 faithful disciples). Place the balls on a baking sheet, brush with egg and also glaze under the grill. Sit the balls on top and cake is ready.
